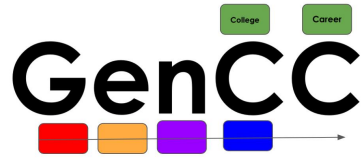

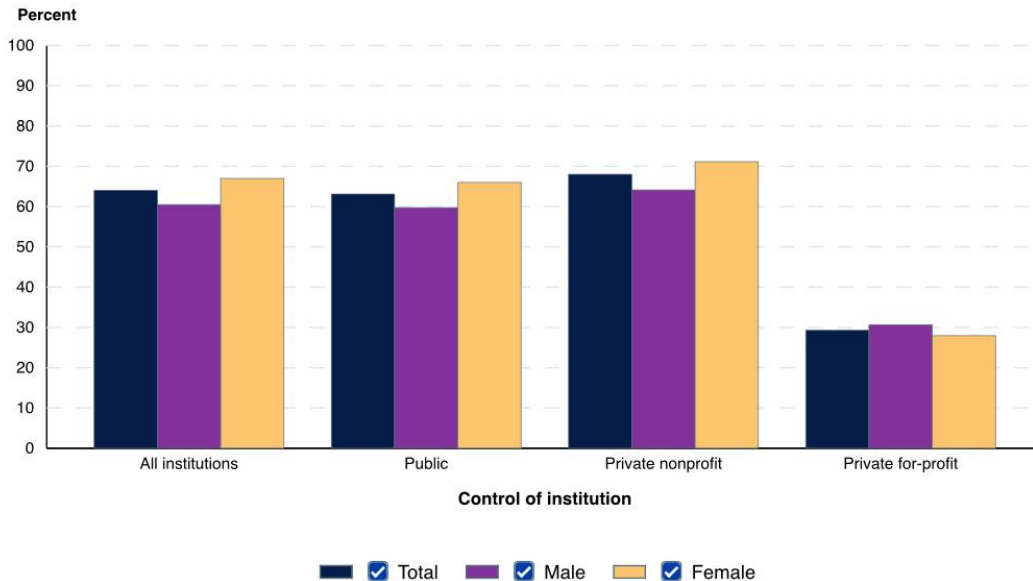
This chart shows US graduation rates for students obtaining an undergraduate degree, public or private, in a four-year institution, over six years.

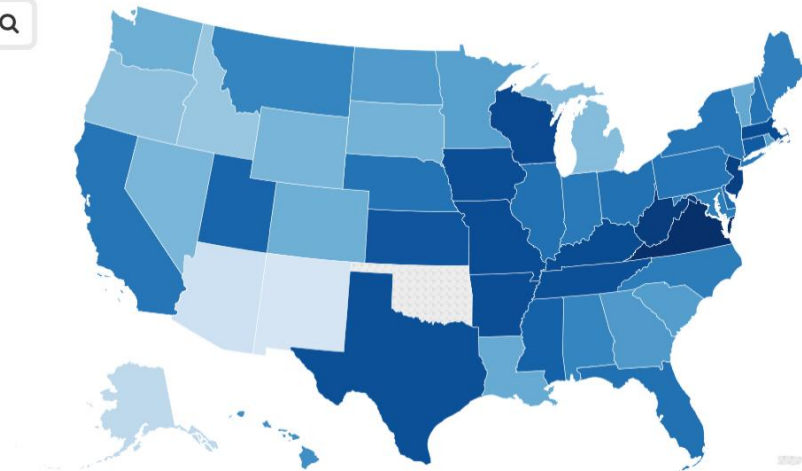
